SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

Ms. Coletti, 7th Grade Assistant Principal

Your child may be eligible to receive free tutoring through the Supplemental Educational Services (SES) program for the 2011 - 2012 school year.

How does my child qualify?

Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch and who attend Title I schools that failed to make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for five years or more are eligible for these services. Your child's school receives federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards.

What is SES?

SES is a program that offers free tutoring to eligible students. Tutoring is offered in mathematics or reading/language arts. This tutoring takes place outside of the regular school day. Each provider offers a different program on different days at different locations. After you research each of the providers, you will choose the provider that can best meet the needs of your child. Tutoring will start within 20 days of processing the completed SES provider selection form.

How do I apply?

An SES Brochure was mailed to your home on August 5, 2011. The SES Brochure included a list of SES approved providers, an SES Provider Selection form and a chart to assist you in choosing an SES Provider. If you did not receive this information and are interested in free tutoring for your child, you may obtain an application and a list of SES Providers from one of the following locations:

You must return the completed SES Provider Selection Form on or before Friday, September 9, 2011 to one of the locations listed above.

If the district receives more SES applications from eligible students than available funds, the District reserves the right to prioritize applications received by the deadline. Priority will be given to students who scored level 1 or 2 on the FCAT in Reading and/or Math.

If you have already completed an SES application, you do not need to complete another application.

S.T.E.M. GRANT for Margate Middle Press Release

Margate, FL – July 28, 2011 – Margate Middle School, a Broward County Public Middle School, today announced it has received \$40,000.00 as part of the Innovation

Generation grant program from the Motorola Solutions Foundation, the charitable arm of Motorola Solutions Inc. Through the grant, Margate Middle School will supplement our STEM Magnet program with science and math hands on projects, field trip opportunities that include local and state competitions. Approximately 400 students will be reached.

This year, the program will provide \$5.5 million to K-12 programs across the U.S., including Margate Middle School, to support hands-on, innovative after-school programs, science and math clubs, teacher training and mentoring programs.

The grant writing team members include: Cara Coletti, Assistant Principal, Nikia Ragin, Magnet Coordinator, Rod Daniel, Lead Science Teacher and Patrick Gayle, Lead Math Teacher.

INTERNET ESSENTIALS

Offer to Students on FREE Lunch for reduced Internet access rate and Computers for \$149.00

What is provided as part of this program? COMCAST is partnering with Broward County Public Schools to offer low-cost, high speed Internet access directly to the homes of students who are eligible for Free Lunch. COMCAST will also make available a computer at a discount and provide free Internet training to get the students and their families started! The cost of \$9.95 a month plus tax is being made available for the next three years and include activation fees and installation.

How will this benefit our students? This program addresses the “digital divide” by addressing two of the barriers to connecting to the Internet – access and computer. These Broward students will be able to access digital textbooks, check on their assignments, access their grades, research information and use instructional learning tools – all available through the Broward Education Enterprise Portal (BEEP) Student system.

How the Program Works:

1. Families with children enrolled in the free lunch program can sign up for low-cost, high-speed Internet service. Cost is \$9.95 per month plus tax.
2. These families can also buy a computer at a discount (\$149.00). The computer is a NETBOOK with wireless card.
3. Training is provided at no-cost to the families by COMCAST
4. COMCAST will install the service and provide parental control software that addresses online security.
5. This offer is available for three school years to families.
6. Families must live in areas with COMCAST service.

How does a Family show evidence of qualification and sign up for the program?

1. Family member calls and 800 number (1-800-765-6995) and makes arrangements with a COMCAST representative.

2. Letter of eligibility for Free Lunch distributed by food service must be sent to COMCAST by the eligible families.
3. COMCAST provides all installation as part of the offer at no cost to families.
4. Families decide whether they want to purchase the NETBOOK at the reduced cost.

How will information be distributed to eligible families?

1. A flyer will be distributed to eligible families who qualify for free lunch through the Food Services Department in conjunction with the application for free lunch.
2. An Internet-Essentials web site (<http://InternetEssentials.com>) provides further details on the program. The Broward Schools website will also provide information on the partnership with COMCAST.
3. Parent-Link Message is sent to the families of students who are enrolled in FREE LUNCH as a reminder.
4. Information can also be found at public libraries and community organizations.

RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

Students who ride the school bus run the risk of disciplinary action if they do not follow a code of discipline. Repeated offenses may result in being expelled from riding the bus for the rest of the school year or even being expelled from school.

The Broward County School Board has a disciplinary matrix for any problems that may occur on the bus. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their children on the way to school and at the bus stop. Students are expected to be at the bus stop at least 10 minutes before the scheduled bus stop time. Schools are only required to provide supervision for 30 minutes before school begins and 30 minutes after school ends.

Those students eligible to ride the bus are:

- Students in pre-kindergarten disability programs
- Kindergarten through 12th grade students whose homes are at least 2 miles away from their assigned schools.

Our school bus drivers are responsible for the safety of our children. This challenging position requires full attention to their driving while transporting the students.
